## SMAHC AWARDS ARTS & LEARNING GRANTS

At the November 22 meeting, the SMAHC Board of Directors voted to award a total of \$12,600 under the Arts & Learning program.

The Arts & Learning grant program offers matching grants to schools and arts organizations for artist residencies and arts-related field trips. Nine grant recipients received the following funding:

We'd like to take a minute to acknowledge the unique opportunity we have in Minnesota for supporting the arts. The Southwest Minnesota Arts & Humanities Council is very thankful and proud to have received funding from the Minnesota Arts and Cultural Heritage Fund.

The Arts and Cultural Heritage Fund came into being as part of the Clean Water, Land and Legacy Amendment to the Minnesota Constitution, which was overwhelmingly passed by Minnesota voters in 2008. The effects of this fund are now being seen all over the state.

However, establishing the Arts and Cultural Heritage fund did not, in itself, mean that artists and organizations would receive funding. It is because the State Legislature directed Arts and Cultural Heritage Fund dollars to the Regional Arts Council system that this funding has brought access to the arts to every corner of the state.

The State Arts Board and Regional Arts Council system was established to fund arts activities in the most efficient way possible, distributed widely and equitably throughout Minnesota. During the last fiscal year, SMAHC Region was able to fund 46 grants totaling \$336,115. Our grant programs funded with ACH dollars include: Art Projects, Legacy for Individual Artists, Legacy for Organizations & Communities, Arts Organization Development and Public Art programs.

We would like to thank Minnesota State Legislature, and you, the voters of Minnesota for making our work possible!


