★ Bill Gossman Named SMAHC 2010 Prairie Star ★

The Southwest Minnesota Arts and Humanities Council is proud to present Bill Gossman as the Prairie Star for 2010. This award was established to honor a distinguished artist whose work exemplifies the highest quality of art in the SMAHC region. New London artist Robert Mattson, nominated Gossman for this award. Mattson wrote "Bill grasps and practices the essence of what it means to be an artist and lives it day to day. Simply put, Bill is the finest potter I have ever known. His work equals or surpasses that of others the world over."

Interview with Bill Gossman

Where were you born – where did you grow up? Tell a little bit about your childhood. I was born in St Paul MN in 1953 and spent my school years in Rochester MN. I have two brothers, one older and one younger. I had a pretty normal childhood and grew up with lots of kids my own age in the neighborhood. We lived on the edge of town then and my pals and I spent a lot of time out in the woods, down by the creek.

Where did you go to school – public school and college? After I graduated from high school I went to Mankato State College for two years and I realized that the academic route wasn't for me.

When did you first begin to be interested in art and specifically in pottery? Being a normal kid I had a normal interest in art right from childhood. Growing up I was always encouraged to draw and paint and it felt good. I can still recall making a small piece of pottery with coils in kindergarten and wishing I could take it to our fort down by the creek and use it for a drink of cool creek water.



What took you abroad to work in Denmark and Africa and how long were you gone? What are some highlights of your stay? When did you return to Minnesota and what brought that about? I went to Denmark to visit a girl in February 1979. I helped on the family dairy farm and eventually went into business with her brother, buying a small sawmill. I had originally hoped to find work at a pottery studio or workshop since I had been making a living as a potter already for several years by then. Continued on Page 7

Upcoming Deadlines for Schools and Individual Artists

There are some important deadlines coming up for schools and individual artists. The deadline for the <u>Arts & Learning Grants</u>, Round 1 is Monday October 4, 2010. This grant program is designed to advance arts education in schools and communities in the SMAHC region through artist/teacher/community partnerships, to support the arts as essential to education and daily life and to enrich the communities of the SMAHC region through the arts.

The Arts & Learning Program will provide financial and technical assistance to schools, communities and nonprofit organizations to involve professional artists to strengthen school and community art programs. An Arts & Learning field trip grant is intended to increase the exposure of students to professional artists through visits to artists' studios, performances by professional theatre, dance or musical groups, readings by writers, visits to art galleries, exhibitions and other locations pertinent to the creation and exhibition of art.

Grants are available for up to \$2,500 for Artist Residencies, \$750 for Pre-packaged Theatre Residencies and \$600 for Field Trips or 90% of the total project cash costs, whichever is less.

The deadline for the <u>Individual Artist Career & Development Grant Programs</u> are <u>December 8</u>, **2010.** Please note that this is the only deadline for this grant program. The SMAHC Individual Artist grant program is designed to aid in career development and arts activities of artists living and working in the eighteen counties of southwestern Minnesota served by the Southwest Minnesota Arts and Humanities Council. It is made possible by funds provided by the McKnight Foundation and the State of Minnesota.

The **Career grant awards up to \$5000** to aid area professional artists. Career artists are defined as those who, for the most part, are at an advanced stage in their career development and have been acknowledged as established artists by other artists and arts professionals within their chosen field. An established artist is expected to have a significant performance, publishing, or exhibition record.

The **Development grant awards up to \$1,500** to aid area emerging artists. Emerging artists are defined as those who, for the most part are at an early stage in their career development. An emerging artist is expected to have a limited, yet clearly promising performance, publishing, or exhibition record.

It is advisable that you submit your grant well ahead of the grant deadline date. If you submit a grant at least a couple weeks before the deadline date, most problems can be identified and corrected by the deadline date, including errors that would make your application ineligible. If you submitted the grant right on the deadline date or you postmark it on the deadline date, there can be no corrections or changes to the grant.

There will be workshops for these upcoming grant programs. The workshop for the **Arts and Learning will be on September 9, 2010 at 4:00** at the SMAHC Office in Marshall. The workshop for the **Individual Artist grant program is November 9, 2010 at 4:00** also at the SMAHC Office in Marshall. There will also be workshops on October 6, 2010 at the Dayton House in Worthington and October 7, 2010 at the Prairie's Edge Casino in Granite Falls. These workshops begin at 6:30 PM. Gossman Continued from Page 1

It didn't come to pass at that time so I constructed my first wood fired kiln at the farm and made pottery when I wasn't working either on the farm or in the woods and sawmill.

In early 1981 I went to Swaziland Africa with my wife who had been hired to work with a Danish aid agency as an agronomist. Quite by chance I met a Canadian potter who was there with his wife in a similar situation. She was an English teacher at a college. Both of our respective wives earned good salaries which meant we were free to be pioneer potters. How nice that was. In 1983 my wife and I returned to Denmark, and she soon after returned to Africa. Then I met Janne, my present wife, and I continued with my pottery and became a father to two children while Janne studied to be a nurse. Before we moved to Minnesota I was working at a traditional Danish pottery workshop for a couple of years. We chose to move to the New London area because a colleague, with whom I had shared studio space in Minneapolis during the 70's, had offered a me a job in his pottery studio making souvenirs for the Rennaisance Faires.



How would you characterize your present work? I have been mainly making functional and one of a kind pottery since I started in the mid 70's. Now my work is a continuation of what I started years ago though much more refined and an expression of all I have seen and experienced up until now. I have also incorporated translucent porcelain into the body of materials that I use in the process. Wood kilns and wood firing also remain a part of my work since my first wood fired kiln in 1979.

Talk about the firing process – tell us about your kiln – any special techniques that you use? My present kiln is now undergoing a transformation. It is built into a hillside and is called a climbing chamber kiln. It has three chambers for ware and one for preheating air for combustion. After reconstruction, the first ware chamber, or the one at the bottom of the hill, will be enlarged to twice the previous volume. It is meant to be used as a learning tool which will enable several potters to fire their ware and learn about the wood firing process while they assist during loading and stoking the kiln. One special process I use is a "once-fire" approach to the firing procedure. This means that I forego a pre-firing or bisque firing which cuts down on fuel and time spent on loading, firing and unloading an extra time.

What would you say to encourage someone who wants to be a potter? I would first recommend that they find a potter who may allow them to help at their studio. Visit other potters and their studios, ask a lot of questions, read a lot of books and get all the hands on experience with clay that they can. Also take some sort of business or marketing class. But most importantly I would tell them to make a lot of pots and practice all the time.

What are some of your hobbies? Besides my main hobby of pottery, I also play music, and there are even a couple of groups that let me hang out with them and play along. I used to make beer and wine but now I just drink it.

Tell a little bit about your family - My wife, Janne, is an original Dane from Denmark. She is a registered nurse working with hospice and ensures we have health coverage. She makes the big bucks. Siri is our oldest daughter and graduated from art school in Boston in 2008. She plans a move to Detroit soon and has an interest in urban farming. Jais, our son, is currently enrolled in an art school in Chicago and hopefully graduates soon. Leah, our youngest, starts at the U of M in Minneapolis in the School of Design.

Congratulations to Bill Gossman on his great accomplishments and on being named the SMAHC Prairie Star of 2010. The award will be officially presented to him at the 36th SMAHC Annual Celebration on October 30, 2010 at the Crow River Golf Club in Hutchinson. Big Stone County Embraces the Arts

Minnesotans care about the arts. We care because the arts inspire us and spark our imaginations.

Minnesota Arts and Cultural Heritage Funds (also known as "Legacy Funds") were awarded to the State Arts Board and regional arts councils to support three main areas: arts & arts access, arts education and arts & cultural heritage. The fund supports Minnesota artists and arts organizations in creating, producing and presenting high-quality arts activities; invests in lifelong learning in the arts; and builds bridges between Minnesotans through arts and culture. SMAHC arts legacy grants are intended for projects or activities that will create a strong arts legacy in Minnesota.



Embracing the importance of art and the impact art can have as an economic engine, representatives from Big Stone county, city, economic development and non-profit organizations have been working together to increase access to quality art experiences and bring public art to the county. Since November of 2009, this steering committee has been focused on opening an arts and culture center where artists and arts appreciators of all ages will come together to create and experience art in its many forms. On two occasions, SMAHC grants allowed the Big Stone Arts Council to hire John Davis, founder of NY Mills Regional Cultural Center and current director of Lanesboro Art Center. Mr. Davis helped increase community awareness of the cultural center initiative with a public presentation on his experience in creating a sustainable art center in a rural community. He has also given invaluable advice on possible buildings, time-lines and business plan efforts.

Recently, Big Stone County rallied behind local sculptor, Doug Holtquist, to help make his public art sculpture possible with in-kind donations to give it a granite base and permanent home on the new bike trail. "Farm Family Portrait" is a mixed media sculptural installation addressing the vanishing, evolving state of America's traditional farm family. It is a group of five Threshing Stools on a 4" thick granite platform arranged as though absent sitters are posing in their Sunday best for a traditional family portrait. This self-initiated, public art project has broad community support and



demonstrates considerable collaboration between the artist, Big Stone County,



Last year SMAHC awarded multiple grants in Big Stone County totaling \$14,631! Projects included a SMAHC Legacy Grant for Career Artists to sculptor Doug Holtquist from Ortonville, a SMAHC/McKnight Challenge grant to the Big Stone Arts Council to match increased donations to the council, a SMAHC/McKnight Arts Organization Networking & Training Grant to work with John Davis to investigate a Cultural Center Initiative in Ortonville, and an Arts & Learning grant to the Ortonville Public School for a music

residency in the high school. Big Stone Arts Council has been working with the band department at Ortonville School and the music department at CGB School to write other grants to bring artists into the schools for winter/spring 2011.

"Farm Family Portrait" was unveiled for a temporary viewing during Family Fun Day, a fundraiser for future trailhead park amenities, at Lakeside Park in Ortonville. MN Senator Gary Kubly and Representative Andrew Falk, showed their support at this fundraiser. Big Stone County SMAHC Board Representative, Deb Larson, had the opportunity to share how busy Big Stone has been growing arts access. Both legislators confirmed their support of the arts and continuing efforts in Big Stone County and applauded plans for the renovation of a building for an arts and culture center.
