SMAHC Gallery to feature the artwork of Bradley Hall

Bradley Hall of Granite Falls will exhibit hand-painted linoleum block prints at the SMAHC Gallery from January 10 through March 1, 2013.

Brad is a watercolor artist living and working in a rehabbed 19th century church, which has been converted into his home and studio. He also carves linoleum blocks for hand printed, and hand painted, linoleum block prints. He received the majority of his artistic training at the American Academy of Art in Chicago.

Brad has been a member of the Meander Art Crawl since it's inception in 2004. He was the first artist to exhibit on the Meander yearly poster. He has had numerous one-man shows in Chicago and Minnesota. He is currently working on framing his own artwork with recycled wood from dilapidated structures on his family's farms.

He has been an active member of the Granite Area Arts Council since 2010. Brad helped set up and coordinate exhibits, talent shows, and was instrumental in launching the Art Gallery at the KK Berge building in downtown Granite Falls. He currently helps manage the KK Berge Gallery in Granite Falls.

Some of his current inspirations are the local architecture, the river valley and the prairies. He quotes; "I don't think many people realize how beautiful this area is. I love to travel the country roads searching for a hidden valley, or a beautiful broken down old barn or shed. For a landscape artist like me, there is a lot of inspiration here."

The public is invited to visit the SMAHC art gallery in downtown Marshall for a reception from 5:00 - 7:00 pm on Thursday, January 10, 2013. Regular Gallery hours are Mon - Fri, 8:00 am to noon and 1:00 - 4:30 pm.

Meet your new SMAHC board members



Kathy Fransen of Jackson was elected as board member for Yellow Medicine County, a position formerly held by Paul Grupe of Jackson. Fransen is a certified clinical musician (harpist) for Osceola Community Hospital and Hospice and a social worker for Sanford Hospice of Windom/Worthington/Jackson. She was a founding member of the Comprehensive Arts Planning Program (CAPP) in the Jackson School System, and is the coordinator of the Rhythm of the River arts festival. Fransen has also been active in Jackson County Art Guilds theatre productions. Her term runs through December 2015.



Janet Olney of Willmar was appointed as board member for Kandiyohi County, completing a term for Connie Feig formerly of Raymond. Olney is a visual artist who has been weaving baskets for 28 years, with multiple solo shows around the area. She served on the Willmar Area Arts Council Board, including two years as president. Olney is currently the coordination for the Willmar Area Arts Council. She is also a founding member and treasurer of Kaleidoscope: An Artists' Gallery in New London. Olney's term runs through December 2013.



Tom Wirt of Hutchinson was appointed to serve as the McLeod County representative, completing a term for Kathy Wnoroski who moved out of the SMAHC region. Wirt is the co-owner and potter at Clay Coyote, and a founding board member of Hutchinson Center for the Arts. He has served as a grant panelist for SMAHC and for the MN State Arts Board. Wirt also was a member of the Hutchinson Joint Planning Commission. His term runs through December 2014.



Emily Olson of Pipestone was appointed to fill a vacancy on the board for Pipestone County. Olson teaches writing to high school students online, and has also taught at the elementary and college levels. With degrees in English and vocal music, Olson also plays piano and guitar. She has participated in plays and musicals, and has studied ballet. Olson says, "To be fully human is to be artistic. All people should be exposed and given the opportunity to be involved in all kinds of art." Olson's term runs through December 2015.



Audrey Fuller of Granite Falls was elected as board member for Yellow Medicine County, a position formerly held by Patricia Enger who moved out of the SMAHC region. Now working as a tribal planner and grant writer for the Upper Sioux Community, Fuller's education was in law and international business. She has served on other nonprofit boards, reviewed grants on a state and federal level, and also has been a SMAHC grant panelist. 
